Painting can be described by itselves even though it claims to be imitated from the realistic. The words, which describe painting has been created for a long time since painting is the very first media of human to learn each others in varies of levels.

Oratory of painting is made and consists of visual elements like line, color, figure, tone, and surface, which represent the "stage of mind". For example, red color makes the feelings of powerful, excite, enthusiastic, while green makes the feelings of fresh, cool and calm.Therefore, painting does exist by being a "representative" or a "sign" which identifies the characteristics of the artist.

The acts of artist derived from blending their own vision and emotions to the surroundings, which is gained through the organ senses.





Yutthasak Roikanchan and Narakorn Sittithes's "Credence" represents their inner status via the paintings which indicates their stage of mind facing outer and expresses to "message" which they want to "commute"

Yutthasak's message represents "energy" which is the untouchable mystery but it does moves along inside the thing called "house of sacred spirits". The movement of moving energy is made of brushing stroke technique, which express the artist's emotions that try to describe the intangible substance and make it more tangible. Therefore intangible substance, which derived from personal belief, comes out tangible.

While message of Narakorn expresses "greediness" the human's endless ambitiousness, which is invisible incarceration that ties up man to unescape. Narakorn uses himself as a medium to express his emotions by the flame in the darkness which reflects the suffering, the translucent body blended with the solid, rose, the use of red color, black, and white which represents the mysterious of human mind. These are consisted of intangible and invisible substance.

Both messages tell the "beliefs" which handed down through the Buddhism and tradition that harmonized with lifestyle of Thai people.

The proof of belief that expressed via the "evidence" by setting hypothesis of bonding relationship of paintings and human mind ' even it had been passed thoughthe era of romanticism and post-modernism, but still be mysterious like "unsolved puzzle" that only people who obsess in it that can see the secret and want to tie themselves up into the bottom end of canvas.
